GETS FOURTH TERM AS SHIPMASTERS GRAND LODGE HEAD

Buffalo, N.Y., Jan. 25 – The Grand Lodge International Shipmasters' association at its session Thursday re-elected Captain Lee C. DeNike, of Highland Park, Mich., grand president for his fourth consecutive term. Captain De Nike is master of one of the D. & C. steamers, sailing out of Detroit.

Captain John J. Powers, of Ogdensburg, was elected first vice-president. Captain J. D. Baird, of Marine City, was re-elected grand treasurer, and M. F. Morgan, Chicago, was re-elected grand secretary.

Grand President DeNike later appointed the following officers: Second vice-president, Captain R. J. Pocock; chaplain, Captain Richard O'Connor; marshal, Captain Fred C. Sturtevant; warden, Captain H. J. Hartman; sentinel, Captain James W. Kelly.

The grand lodge decided to hold its next convention at Algonac, Mich., in January, 1924. Captain John J. Powers was appointed to visit Ottawa and confer with the dominion department of marine and fisheries relative to Canadian aids to navigation.

The remainder of the session today was devoted to listening to the reading of committees' reports and other routine matters. It is expected the grand lodge will complete its business at Friday morning's session. The delegates were the guests of the Buffalo lodge at a theater party tonight.
