2020 CONVENTION

ISMA Grand Lodge delegates and members gathered in Port Huron for the 130th Annual Convention. Those who attended experienced productive meetings, interesting speakers and programs, and renewal of friendships.

Grand Lodge business meetings opened at 0800 on Thursday, January 30, 2020. Following the opening ritual, Grand President **Mark Mather** presented his report. "I feel so very privileged to have served you and this great organization during the past year," he said. **Mark** and his wife **Laura** were able to attend Blessing of the Fleet observances in both Owen Sound, ONT, and Detroit, MI, as well as the Industry Day conference hosted by Chicago Lodge #3.

Grand Secretary-Treasurer **Brian Eickel** reported that there are 662 ISMA members as of December 31, 2019. This is a decrease of 16 from 2018. Thirteen members passed away, and 29 were dropped or suspended; however, there were 32 new or reinstated members.

The report of Scott Skzrypczak, Navigation, Engineering and Legislative Committee (NELC) Chairman, covered topics including the Jones Act, the pending new lock at the Soo, icebreaking operations, aids to navigation, electronic charts and navigation, and modernization efforts of charted Lake Carriers' Association (LCA) courses on the Great Lakes. This effort was spearheaded by Cleveland Lodge #4 member Capt. Tim Dayton. Scott noted that lake shipping must remain involved in decisions involving the Lakes and connecting waterways. Canadian NELC Co-Chairman Seann O'Donoughue sent his report on involvement at the annual Marine Advisory Committee meeting at Georgian College, attendance at the Great Lakes Waterways Conference, and at the LCA Captains Meeting. The Canadian NELC was also involved with the Chamber of Marine Commerce (CMC) in updating the LCA/ CSA recommended courses on the Great Lakes. In addition, NELC was concerned with several Canadian Hydrographic Service (CHS) projects and aids to navigation.

PGP **Russell Brohl**, member of the Scholarship Committee, read Chairman **Seann O'Donoughue**'s Scholarship Award report. There were seven applicants for the three 2020 awards of \$1500 each. The following recipients were announced: Georgian Marine Training Centre Cadet Award – **Yevgeny Belgradov**, 3rd Year Navigation Cadet; Great Lakes Maritime Academy Cadet Award – **Heidi Wager**, 3rd Year Navigation Cadet; and Hawse Pipe Award – **Thomas Blakely**, Chicago Lodge #3, who upgraded his license. Donations to the Scholarship Fund are always welcome, especially since the fund is now nearly depleted.

Actions brought before the Grand Lodge and approved included: a proposal to investigate the formation of an ISMA Foundation, a non-profit organization, designed for solicitation of tax deductible donations to be used primarily for mariner scholarships; a proposal and a constitutional amendment to ensure that all ISMA documents including our Constitution and By-Laws are consistent in using the four-word organizational name – International Ship Masters' Association.

Convention attendees were also treated to a variety of guest speakers, including **Ken Gerasimos**, General Manager, Key Lakes/Great Lakes Fleet; **Jim Weakley**, President, LCA; a panel discussion on autonomous shipping technology; a panel presentation on the Enbridge Line 5 Anchor Strike Mitigation Plan; speakers covering the Soo Locks update, icebreaking, Detroit-Windsor Bridge construction, NOAA National Weather Service, and aids to navigation; and a dinner presentation on shipping in the late 1800s and the founding of ISMA which included historical music. Keynote speaker at Friday's Grand Ball was **Mark Barker**, President of The Interlake

Steamship Company. Optional tours of USCGC *Hollyhock* and Sarnia Traffic Center were available. An Oktoberfest celebration rounded out the weekend.
