At the annual meeting of Detroit lodge of the Shipmasters' association, yesterday afternoon, the following officers were elected: President, Capt. F. J. Simpson; first vice-president, Capt. B. S. Baker; second vice-president, Capt. Alex Clark; treasurer, Capt. Alex J. McKay; recording secretary, Capt. L. P. Anderhalt. Capt. Simpson has been first vice-president, and Capt. Baker has been second vice-president. Capt. Anderhalt was elected secretary for the fifth term, while Capt. McKay now begins his second year as treasurer.

Capt. A. J. Mahon, retiring president, declined to stand for re-election. He has made an excellent record while in office, as there has been an increase in membership of 25, ten of these being active and 15 honorary members. Capt. McKay reports the treasury in excellent shape.
